Government officials and employees make decisions balancing evidence, ethics, and public interest, ranging from high-level policy setting to operational, daily choices. They must navigate political pressure, ensure transparency, and manage budgetary constraints while using data-driven insights to meet citizen needs. Key decisions focus on risk management, stakeholder collaboration, and compliance with strict ethics laws.

An example of a local government issue is share: Local governments have a host of issues to solve on an ongoing basis. Municipal governments are made up of many different departments including housing, roads and transportation, library, building and zoning, planning, public works, police, fire, water, sewage, education and more.

Governmental decision means a determination, action, vote, or disposition upon a motion, proposal, recommendation, resolution, ordinance, or measure on which a vote by the members of a legislative or governing body of a public entity is required and by which a public entity formulates or effectuates public policy.

This webinar will explore the decisions one has to make as government officials and employees. The webinar will look beyond the local government ethics laws and discuss the legal and ethical boundaries faced in local government today.
